Anticoagulants: Prescribing Information and Practice Implications for the Advanced **Practice Nurse**

Lori Brien, MS, ACNP

Anticoagulant medications are prescribed to many patients for a variety of reasons to include atrial fibrillation, acute coronary syndrome, mechanical heart valves, vascular disease or thrombosis. In addition, patients are prescribed anticoagulant agents to prevent clot formation while immobilized due to critical illness or surgery. Warfarin was the mainstay of oral anticoagulation therapy for many years. While Warfarin was widely available, effective, inexpensive and had a reversal agent, it also had many limitations. Warfarin has a delayed onset of action, a narrow therapeutic window and interacts with many medications and foods. Due to these limitations, newer agents were developed to replace Warfarin. The newer oral anticoagulants include direct thrombin inhibitors and factor Xa inhibitors. The mechanism of action of these medications will be reviewed with relation to their effect on the clotting cascade. The dosing, pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics and side effects of each agent will be discussed. The availability of reversal agents will also be reviewed as will the perioperative management of patient's prescribed direct oral anticoagulants.
