
The VCNP Conference Committee is chaired by Helen Willis. Helen and the Conference Committee, which consists of representatives serving from all regions, have

NEEDS ASSESSMENT & OBJECTIVES

The Virginia Council of Nurse Practitioners (VCNP) is a nonprofit 501(c)6 organization with nearly 1,800 members. The organizational mission is to facilitate the advancement of the nurse practitioner (NP) profession, enhance continuing professional development through local meetings and the state conference. VCNP leadership promotes political advocacy to influence state and national health policy. The objectives of the VCNP Annual Conference are to provide an educational curriculum and enhance the knowledge and skills of NPs in varied practice roles. The conference also offers collegial networking opportunities, emerging trends in practice management and highlights political issues affecting NP roles and practice. VCNP is committed to providing education for NPs. Educational needs are identified though surveys, practice pattern analysis, previous contact hours activity evaluations, current practice issues and emerging technology. The conference curriculum is developed by the conference planning committee comprised of NP representatives from the regions, the VCNP President, President-Elect and the Conference Chair. It is anticipated that over 500 NPs will be in attendance at the 2020 Annual Conference held at the Hilton Norfolk The Main, March 4-7, 2020. The Virginia Council of Nurse Practitioners is an approved provider of continuing nursing education by the Virginia Nurses Association, an accredited approver by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation. Contact hours and Pharmacology hours will be available at this conference. Conference participants will have the opportunity to earn up to 21 contact hours (pending approval).
