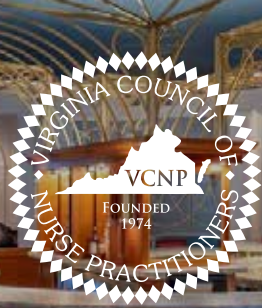

VCNP leadership promotes political advocacy to influence state and national health policy. The objectives of the VCNP Annual Conference are to provide an educational curriculum and enhance the knowledge and skills of NPs in varied practice roles. The conference also offers collegial networking opportunities, emerging trends in practice management and highlights political issues affecting NP roles and practice. VCNP is committed to providing education for NPs. Educational needs are identified through surveys, practice pattern analysis, previous contact hours activity evaluations, current practice issues and emerging technology. The conference curriculum is developed by the conference planning committee comprised of NP representatives from the regions, the VCNP President, President-Elect and the Conference Chair. It is anticipated that over 350 NPs will be in attendance at the 2023 Annual Conference held at the Hotel Roanoke, March 22-25, 2023.
