Coding & Documentation: Know Your Worth

It is every APRNs fiscal responsibility to understand the revenue stream within a practice whether employed or owner of a practice. APRN education focuses on the clinical aspects of training and little on the business side of generating revenue for a practice by correct coding and documentation for APRN services. Evaluation and management (E&M) documentation guidelines provide criteria for medical decision-making vs time to secure a billable for the APRN service. Without a thorough understanding in utilization of E&M guidelines, documentation to support CPT and ICD-10 coding levels, practice revenue stream can be affected. When a service is under coded, revenue is lost. When a service is overcoded, overvaluing increases potential liability. Learn how to reduce the likelihood of denials which affect the bottom line.
